Document Consultation 16/02/2011 – 30/03/2011



SUMMARY OF RESPONSES

This is a summary of some of the key issues emerging from the consultation process. Fuller versions of the representations can be viewed below.

Five representations were received from residents the majority of whom thought that the summary of the neighbourhood was a reasonable reflection of the situation.

Shopping

There was general dissatisfaction with the local shopping facilities. Specific reference was made to the difficulty in accessing the local centres on foot due to the hills.

Local issues

Most respondents referred to the lack of community facilities for young and old. Traffic, lack of green spaces and difficulties walking and cycling around the neighbourhood were also mentioned.

Important Greenspaces

Eggbuckland Green (EG04) was identified as being an important green space for leisure and recreation. Other spaces that were described as being very pleasant and providing a good community resource include EG01, EG03, EG05 and EG06. Other comments included; Improving public access to EG12 and a green space at Ducane Walk should be protected.

Potential Development Sites

Area between Eggbuckland church and Shirburn Road would be ideal for an adult/youth centre or library.

EG05/EG06 could be developed for community purposes.

Potential for a community meeting place at Fort Austin.

Other Comments

- Green public spaces need to be dog free.
- Lack of street cleansing.
- Improve access to EG01, EG03 and EG04.
- Better links with Leigham not desirable.
- Provision of a pedestrian crossing on Forder Valley Road at junction with Blunts Lane for safety reasons.
- Traffic control measures on Church Hill.
- Lack of dropped kerbs at Forder Battery and Goosewell Hill and safe cross over points on Church Hill and Fort Austin Ave.
- Poor quality park/shop.
