

## **Annex 4. Greenscape Schedule.**

### ***Notes on interpretation of the Greenscape Schedule.***

#### **General – Functions.**

1. The 8 criteria of Policy 69 relate directly to the functions as set out in the schedule. Where any of the 8 functions exist on any particular site the schedule displays an annotation (either N, D, C, R, Nat or Int). The annotation indicates the scale at which the functions are important.
2. The annotation displayed relates to the following scales of importance:  
**Neighbourhood, District, City-wide, Regional, National, International.**
3. Sites displaying functions of city-wide or higher importance, particularly for criterion 4 and 5, will tend to the most sensitive and are either important elements of the character of the whole city and / or they contain functions which are important to the city.
4. Sites displaying functions of higher importance, e.g. 'C', may also play important roles at a more local level i.e. 'N' or 'D'. For instance areas of city-wide importance for informal recreation will also be important at the neighbourhood and district level.

#### **Criteria 1. Informal Recreation.**

1. It is not only sites displaying higher levels of importance, e.g. 'C', that are considered important to safeguard. Sites providing only local functions may be very important at that local level and their loss or reduction could have significant adverse impact on a local community.
2. 'Greenscape' sites containing Informal recreational functions will mean that the public will have free and open access over most of the site, upon which they can enjoy informal leisure pursuits. It does not necessarily mean that the site is public open space. The recognition of this function in the 'Greenscape' policy designation is for planning purposes only and does not infer or confer rights of public access / use. 'Greenscape' sites that perform this function may include some land which has no public access over it, and as such perform no informal recreational function. However, the 'Greenscape' site when looked at as a whole can be rightly considered to perform an informal recreational function. Consideration and subsequent decisions over applications for development should reflect the facts pertinent to any particular site.

#### **Criteria 2.Sport & Formal Recreation.**

1. Open air sports facilities can form part of the city's greenscape resource and they can also display multiple functions. For instance, a playing pitch in a park will function as both formal and informal recreation space. On the other hand, other formal sports facilities, to which access is limited, e.g. most school playing fields, will not perform the same range of functions.

Key to scale of importance of the functions:  
**Neighbourhood, District, City, Regional, National, International**

2. Where the sports facility is considered to form part of the city's 'Greenscape', decisions over applications impacting on this specific function are recognised in this policy, but the principle policies relevant to this function are 60 & 62, whether or not the sports facility is inside or out of a 'Greenscape Area'.

### **Criteria 3. Habitats & Species.**

1. Some 'Greenscape' policy sites are also subject to statutory conservation designations. Where this is the case the particular designation is identified in the 'Notes' column of the schedule. The designation applies to the entire 'Greenscape' policy site. The designations include:
  - a. **SSSI** – Site of Special Scientific Interest. These will display an '**Nat**' in Habitat & Species column, **criteria 3**. See also Local Plan Policy 70.
  - b. **SPA** – Special Preservation Area. These will display an '**Int**' in Habitat & Species column, **criteria 3**. See also Local Plan Policy 70.
  - c. **SAC** – candidate Special Area for Conservation. These will display an '**Int**' in Habitat & Species column, **criteria 3**. See also Local Plan Policy 70.

The whole of any such designation, e.g. Tamar-Tavy SSSI, may however consist of a more than one site (e.g. 'Greenscape' policy site numbers 53 & 52).

These designations are part of the city's 'Greenscape'. However they possess designations of greater than City-wide importance which were inherited from other statutory origins. Applications for development that impact on this specific function will therefore be judged against the relevant Local Plan or Structure Plan Policy in addition to the wider issues addressed in Policy 69.

2. Any individual 'Greenscape' policy site identified on the Proposals Map that contains the annotation 'C' or 'R' will apply to either the whole or very significant part of the 'Greenscape' site (more than 75%).
3. Any individual 'Greenscape' site identified on the Proposals Map that contains the annotation 'N' or 'D' will apply only to parts of the site displaying the existence of nature conservation features, such as smaller groups of trees, trees, hedges, species or small habitats etc. Applications for development that impact upon these scales of nature conservation feature will be judged against Policy 71 'Protection of landscape features, habitats and species'. It should be noted that there will be occasions where a particularly important nature conservation feature exists in a site displaying a 'N' or 'D'. Such features could be 'Red-data' book species that might be nationally rare, but which are too small to plot on the Proposals Map, or the existence of which was not known.

### **Criteria 4. Visual Amenity.**

1. Some 'Greenscape' policy sites are also subject to non-statutory and statutory amenity designations. Where this is the case the particular designation is identified in the 'Notes' column of the schedule. The designation applies to the entire 'Greenscape' policy site. The designations include:

- a. **AGLV** – Area of Great Landscape Value. These will display an ‘R’ in Visual Amenity column, **criteria 4**. See also Structure Plan Policy C6.
- b. **CPA** – Coastal Preservation Area. These will display an ‘R’ in Visual Amenity column, **criteria 4**. See also Structure Plan Policy C7.
- c. **AONB** – Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty. These will display an ‘Nat’ in Visual Amenity column, **criteria 4**. See also Structure Plan Policy C4.

The whole of any such designation, e.g. South Devon AONB, may however consist of more than one site (e.g. ‘Greenscape’ policy site numbers 347, 348 & 401).

These designations are part of the city’s ‘Greenscape’. However, as they possess designations of greater than city-wide importance which were inherited from either the Structure Planning process or from other statutory origins, applications for development that impact on this specific function will be judged against the relevant Local Plan or Structure Plan Policy in addition to the wider issues addressed in Policy 69.

**Criteria 5. Separation / buffer.**

- 1. This function of green space prevents coalescence of districts within the urban areas and defines the urban edge of the city. At a very local scale small green spaces break up built development in neighbourhoods and contribute towards local amenity and quality of life. Decisions regarding the potential loss of such small scale separation areas will be made in relation to local circumstances.

**Criteria 6. Access corridors.**

- 1. This function applies to cycling and / or pedestrian access routes. In the case of private land, it does not infer wider rights of access over land other than a particular and specified route(s). Routes have only been acknowledged where there is either legal right of way or known permitted right of way.

**Criteria 7. Historical / cultural.**

- 1. This function primarily draws on a site’s historic and archaeological function and, less frequently, contemporary cultural associations.
- 2. Some ‘Greenscape’ policy sites include features that are also subject to non-statutory and statutory heritage designations. Where this is the case the particular designation is identified in the ‘Notes’ column of the schedule. The designation will normally apply only to part of the ‘Greenscape’ policy site. The designations include:
  - a. **Loc. A&HS** – Locally Important Unscheduled Archaeological & Historic Site. These will display an ‘C’ or ‘R’ in Historical / cultural column, **criteria 7**. See also policy 73.
  - b. **Nat. A&HS** – Nationally Important Unscheduled Archaeological & Historic Site. These will display an ‘Nat’ in Historical / cultural column, **criteria 7**. See also Policy 73.

Key to scale of importance of the functions:  
**Neighbourhood, District, City, Regional, National, International**

- c. **SAM** – Scheduled Ancient Monument. These will display an ‘**Nat**’ in Historical / cultural column, **criteria 7**. See also Policy 73.
- d. **LHP&G** – Local (non registered) Historic Park & Garden. These will display an ‘**R**’ or ‘**Nat**’ in Historical / cultural column, **criteria 7**.
- e. **RHP&G** – Registered Historic Park & Garden. These will display an ‘**Nat**’ in Historical / cultural column, **criteria 7**.

**Criteria 8. Countryside/ food growing.**

1. This function identifies areas of countryside and agricultural land, either within or on the edge of the city. Active and well used allotments are identified as having a food growing function.
