CPR – Understanding Child Protection Refresher (half-day)

Target Audience	<p>Inter-agency training for all workers in any agencies accessed by children, young people and/or their parents and families; practitioners across all sectors, and their managers (as specified by Working Together 2010 Group 3+, and Level 3 of Inter-collegiate NHS criteria).</p> <p>This half-day refresher course is for all staff who require updating on Safeguarding and Child Protection policies and procedures, and have previously attended an <i>inter-agency</i> “Introduction to Child Protection” course (for example, the PSCB “Understanding Child Protection” Foundation course).</p> <p>It is essential that all participants have completed <u>at least</u> the one-day CPF Understanding Child Protection Inter-agency Training or recognised equivalent. This course will not be appropriate for those with no child protection training or awareness. If the applicant has not attended a core Introduction to multi-agency child protection in the last four years, they are expected to attend the full one-day course.</p>
Aims and objectives	<p>Course Aim: To provide a wide range of participants with up-to-date knowledge and understanding of child abuse issues.</p> <p>Objectives: By the end of the course participants will have had the opportunity to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Understand current legal developments, procedures and policies. • have shared contemporary knowledge, experience and feelings in relation to child abuse work, from various disciplines and agencies • Understand the changing roles and functions of other agencies • Consider the requirement for emotional intelligence and empathy in the process of securing accurate assessment of a child’s safety. • To be aware of the importance of sharing information about a child who may have been abused. <p>Learning Outcomes: By the end of this course, participants will be able to understand:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • the legal framework within which the child protection legislation lies • that the Child’s Interests are Paramount • the use and value of the South West Child Protection Procedures • the roles and functions of the different agencies, of Inter-Agency working, and of the importance of sharing relevant information • the practice of “Partnership with Parents” • application of the Common Conceptual Framework for Assessment. • the impact of values and attitudes upon assessment, and the importance of anti-discriminatory practice when making judgements and decisions.

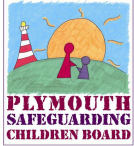

CSAA Understanding Child Sexual Abuse

Course description	<p>Structure: One day training, providing participants from different agencies with the information and context necessary to be alert to signals that a child may be suffering from child sexual abuse and to know what to do. These include</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>Child behavioural indicators</i> • <i>Situational, contextual and cultural factors</i> • <i>Listening to children skills</i> • <i>Procedural and practice issues</i> <p>It is essential that all participants have completed <u>at least</u> the one-day CPF Understanding Child Protection training or recognised equivalent training. This course will not be appropriate for those with no child protection training or awareness.</p>
Aims and objectives	<p>Aim: To provide participants with awareness and understanding of contexts, meanings and information to enable them to contribute to safeguarding children from child sexual abuse.</p> <p>Learning Outcomes:</p> <p>By the end of the day, participants will</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Have increased awareness of how to recognise if a child is being sexually abused. 2. Be reassured of positive outcomes by practical examples where children have been helped to survive child sexual abuse and achieve positive adult relationships. 3. Be aware of relevant changes in legislation. 4. Have received basic information about child sexual abuse and technology such as the internet. 5. Recognise the importance of an understanding of child development, including sexual development. 6. Be familiar with some of the contextual and environmental factors to consider in cases of child sexual abuse. 7. Appreciate the significance of factors and influences related to culture, religion and ethnicity. 8. Have gained understanding of how offenders think and act, including grooming techniques of victims and others. 9. Understand the importance of co-operative working in order to safeguard children. 10. Have working knowledge of policies and procedures, including what to do if they believe a child is a victim of sexual abuse. 11. Know what to do if a child discloses sexual abuse. 12. Identify what makes children vulnerable to sexual abuse. 13. Have learning of impacts, short-term and long-term, of child sexual abuse. 14. Recognise impacts on workers.

This course requires participants to have previously attended the PSCB <i>Introduction to Child Protection</i> (Intermediate) Training (or equivalent) <i>and</i> the one-day PSCB <i>Understanding Child Sexual Abuse</i> or equivalent.
Aims and objectives	<p><u>Learning Outcomes:</u></p> <p>At completion of this Advanced course, the participant will have studied and reflected, considered and better understood:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Signs & Symptoms of sexual abuse • processes that lead to incidents of Child Sexual Abuse; • types of perpetrator • the mind-set of abusers • methods of abuse; • the contemporary development in the prevention of Cyber-Abuse • effects upon the child and family (immediate, medium & long-term) • lessons from research • recognition of power dynamics in families • consideration of safe and unsafe situations • methods of working with children following abuse to promote survival • methods of working with families, including perpetrators, to keep children safe • strategies for the development of professional multi-agency networks to promote Child Safety and Welfare, in pursuit of the statutory <i>Working Together</i> guidelines for best practice.

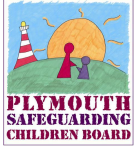

Appreciate the significance of factors and influences related to culture, religion and ethnicity. 7. Have gained understanding of how offenders think and act. 8. Appreciate models of working with offenders to prevent domestic abuse. 9. Understand the importance of co-operative working in order to safeguard children. 10. Have working knowledge of policies and procedures, including what to do if they believe a child is a victim of domestic abuse. 11. Know what to do if a child discloses domestic abuse. 12. Have learning of impacts, short-term and long-term, of child domestic abuse. 13. Recognise impacts on workers.

Aims and objectives	<p><u>Aim:</u> Participants will be able to adopt and use the PSCB Multi-Agency Model for safeguarding children involved in Domestic Abuse, and maintain the assessment imperatives for Best Practice.</p> <p><u>Learning Outcomes:</u> At completion of this Advanced course, the participant will have had the opportunity to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Consider contemporary research and knowledge of the effects of Domestic Abuse on children (short/medium/long-term) • Understand use of power and control • Explore and analyse scenarios • Evaluate the characteristics of the Abuser • Consider Risk Assessment Best Practice • Identify the criminal justice procedures, including working with offenders • Explore the links between domestic abuse, sexual abuse and child abuse • Reduce risk to women and children by working within the Multi-Agency model

These include</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ <i>Child behavioural indicators</i> ▪ <i>Situational, contextual and cultural factors</i> ▪ <i>Listening to children and Observational skills</i> ▪ <i>Procedural and practice issues</i> <p>Aim: Provide participants with awareness and understanding of contexts, meanings and information to enable them to contribute to safeguarding children from bullying and abuse on-line.</p> <p>Learning Outcomes: By the end of the training, participants will have considered and understood:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. The potentials, opportunities, uses and risks of ICT. 2. Legislation pertaining to ICT, including Data Protection Act for privacy, and the Sexual Offences Act 2003 designed to protect children from sexual exploitation on the Internet. 3. The continuum for safeguarding children on the internet, from risk-taking behaviours to child abuse 4. Cyberbullying 5. Tactics used by paedophiles and sexual predators on the Internet 6. Investigation procedures –Child Protection: Social Work and Police 7. Signs & symptoms of cyber-abuse 8. Working Together to prevent Cyber-Abuse – support available

Learning Outcomes:

- To develop knowledge and understanding of the main substances used and their effects
- To explore views on parents / carers use of substances
- To gain an understanding of the key messages and recommendations from the Hidden Harm Report 2003; Hidden Harm Three Years On: Realities, Challenges and Opportunities 2007 (Advisory Council for the Misuse of Drugs) and the Plymouth Multi-Agency Strategy: Hidden Harm – Taking the Next Steps Together 2009-11 (PSCB)
- To develop knowledge and understanding of how children's key developmental milestones may be affected through parental / carer substance misuse
- To be aware of how the CAF, the Framework for Assessment and specific guidance on assessing parental substance misuse can be utilised to identify risk and analyse risk
- To apply learning from the course and from participant experience through the use of case studies
- To support the importance of multi-agency working through the use of case studies

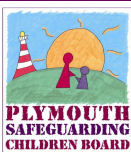

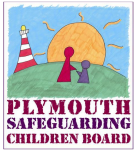

Learning Objectives:

1. Be able to identify the various ways children may be neglected and how children may present
2. Understand why judgments about neglect are difficult
3. Recognise that our attitudes, beliefs, emotions and experiences influence our views
4. Understand the importance of maintaining the focus on the child
5. Have working knowledge of policies and procedures, including what to do if they believe a child is a victim of domestic abuse.
6. Know what to do if concerned a child is at risk of neglect.
7. Have learning of impacts, short-term and long-term, of child neglect
8. Recognise impacts on workers of dealing with cases of child neglect.

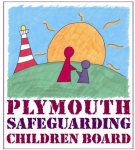
