



The Future Pattern of Secondary Education - Academies

Notice is given in accordance with section 15(1) of the Education and Inspections Act 2006 that Plymouth City Council, Director of Services for Children and Young People (ref JEG), Plymouth City Council, Plymouth PL1 2AA intends to discontinue John Kitto Community College, Honicknowle Lane, Pennycross, Plymouth PL5 3NE and Tamarside Community College, Trevithick Road, Higher St Budeaux, Plymouth PL5 2AF on 31 August 2010.

All pupils on roll will continue their schooling at the newly opened Academies on the current school sites and the full range of education and training opportunities will be maintained. Admission may also be sought to other schools which have places available.

The existing school transport arrangements will continue to apply. The new Academies will develop School Travel Plans aimed at reducing car usage.

The proposals to discontinue John Kitto Community College and Tamarside Community College are not related, one could go ahead without the other.
