Elizabethan House

32 New Street, The Barbican PL1 2NA

Go back in time to Drake's Plymouth and see how a merchant or sea captain might have lived in the 1600s. Spiral stairs, sloping floors, period furniture and fabrics, plus restored gardens and kitchen give you a real feeling of history.

See four mini museums under one roof in this former home of famous Elizabethan privateer, William Parker. Old curiosities, a Victorian schoolroom, Blitz themed room, and more provide a fascinating snapshot of Plymouth's recent past.

LANDMARK LIGHTHOUSE



Smeaton's Tower

The Hoe, Plymouth, PL1 2NZ

Experience life at the top with a visit to our landmark lighthouse. A centrepiece on Plymouth's Hoe, Smeaton's Tower was originally built on the Eddystone reef in 1759.

It was taken down in the early 1880s and approximately two thirds of its structure was moved stone by stone to its current resting place.

Now standing at 72 feet high, it offers fantastic views of Plymouth Sound and beyond from its Lantern Room. Can you climb the 93 steps to the top?

TRAVEL AND PARKING

There are a number of different ways to get to our sites and plenty of parking nearby.

Train:

There are regular services to Plymouth station, which is a short taxi or bus ride from all three sites.

Bus and Coach:

Merchant's House: any bus that runs via Royal Parade.

Elizabethan House and Smeaton's Tower:

Plymouth CityBus No 25 which runs via Southside Street and The Hoe.

The main bus and coach station (Bretonside) is a short walk from all three sites.

Park and Ride services to the city centre are also available.

Car:

Pay and display parking is available near all three sites.

The nearest multi-storey car parks are in Drake Circus shopping mall or to the rear of the Theatre Royal.

There are also additional car parks on the Barbican and plenty of on-street parking (short stay) around the Barbican and Hoe.



ACCESS AND FACILITIES

The following information should be useful to you when visiting our historic sites.

- Due to the historic nature of the sites we regret that there is limited disabled access.
- Children under 12 must be accompanied by an adult when visiting Smeaton's Tower due to its steep ladders and narrow openings.
- There are no toilet facilities at our sites although public conveniences are available nearby.
- Food and drink are not allowed.
- On certain days, Smeaton's Tower and the Elizabethan House may be closed for civil ceremonies.
