

EARLY YEARS NATIONAL FUNDING FORMULA



CONSULTATION ON THE EARLY YEARS FUNDING FROM 2021/22

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INTRODUCTION

1. Central Government have recently published early years hourly funding rates for 2021/22. These rates are paid to local authorities to deliver the free early education entitlement for 2, 3 and 4 year olds.
2. Plymouth will receive an hourly funding rate of £4.71 for 3 and 4 year olds, an increase of £0.06 per hour compared 2020/21 funding levels.
3. Plymouth will receive an hourly funding rate of £5.36 for 2 year olds, an increase of £0.08 per hour compared 2020/21 funding levels.
4. Several deductions are made to the 3 and 4 year old hourly rate to arrive at the funding rate that is paid to providers. Deductions are made for the deprivation supplement, central expenditure and the SEND inclusion fund. The proposed deductions for 2021/22 are included in this consultation.
5. Since 2019/20, all childcare providers have received the same hourly rate for their 3 and 4 year olds, including Maintained Nursery Schools. This requirement of the Early Years National Funding Formula (EYNFF) will continue in 2021/22.
6. Plymouth will continue to receive the Maintained Nursery School (MNS) supplementary fund in 2021/22, the indicative allocation is £0.372m, the same amount received in 2020/21. This grant has protected MNS funding at historic levels that existed before the introduction of the EYNFF. Central Government has confirmed that the amount for April – August (£0.155m) is indicative and will be updated on the same basis as the universal entitlement. However, the amount for September – March (£0.217m) is conditional, as this may be subject to change and local authorities should therefore treat this as unconfirmed.

PLYMOUTH'S FUNDING FORMULA

1. There are currently 85 PVI's (Private Voluntary Institutions), 80 Childminders, 25 Nursery School Units and 2 Maintained Nursery Schools in Plymouth.

3 and 4 year old Funding

2. Providers will continue to receive the same hourly funding rate for both the universal entitlement and the extended entitlement.
3. The table below shows the calculation of the proposed hourly funding rate that will be paid to all providers in 2021/22 compared to 2020/21 funding levels.

4. Plymouth propose paying all providers an hourly funding rate of £4.28 for their 3 and 4 year olds. This is an increase of £0.07 per hour compared to 2020/21 baselines.

Central Expenditure

1. Local authorities are required to pass on at least 95% of 3 and 4 year old funding from Central Government to providers. Early Years Pupil Premium (EYPP), Disability Access Funding (DAF) and MNS supplementary funding do not count towards the pass through rate.
2. Plymouth met this pass through requirement in 2020/21 as 3.4% of 3 and 4 year old funding was retained to fund central expenditure.
3. The 2020/21 central expenditure budget of £482,504 was funded by a deduction of £0.16 from the 3 and 4 year old hourly rate.
4. This funding is used to deliver early years statutory duties as specified in Early education and childcare statutory guidance for local authorities (June 2018).
5. Central expenditure is spent on staffing to provide (however not limited to):

- secure childcare for children 0-14 years that is Ofsted registered, sufficient, flexible, high quality and sustainable, childcare that supports children that are the most vulnerable and hard to reach and children with SEND. Childcare for parents who are working, accessing training and higher education. This includes out of school, breakfast and holiday club provision to enable parents to access childcare that is available all day and all year
- identify, develop and commission childcare business opportunities
- consult, agree and fund settings using a locally-determined and transparent funding formula, which complies with Department for Education guidance
- provide comprehensive and up to date information about childcare and early education for parents, prospective parents and carers to access their free childcare entitlements
- identify children who qualify for the Early Years Pupil Premium, the Disability Access Fund and Two Year Old Funding and work with other agencies to promote these
- support children with SEND and their families to access support
- maintain the Local Offer and support settings to implement SEND support, access funding and use the Graduated Approach
- support the most vulnerable children to access support and services
- support practitioners to access child protection training and to adhere to robust safeguarding practices
- support strategies that provide early help for emerging need and complexities
- support parents who experience problems accessing their entitlements, this includes liaising with settings, children's centres and health visitors, HM Revenue & Customs and the Department for Education
- ensure that foster parents and providers apply for 30 hours free childcare through the local authority and access the additional hours in accordance with the child's care plan
- ensure that foster parents and Zambrano families (*a Zambrano right is granted to a non-EEA parent of a child who is a British citizen if it is the only way to guarantee the right of the child to live in the UK (or the rest of the EEA). But it is not issued where another carer may be available for the child (e.g. the other parent) receive support accessing entitlements*)
- provide training, advice and guidance and business support for settings judged 'Requires Improvement or Inadequate' by Ofsted
- provide information to childcare providers through online resources, relevant training, briefings and consultation events
- deal with complaints and/or concerns raised by parents/carers, members of the public and settings and (when appropriate) raise these with the appropriate regulatory authorities
- produce childcare sufficiency data to provide a detailed analysis of the childcare market, the number and range of childcare places, new housing developments, areas of growth and gaps in the market
- administer an annual Early Years Census and review these regularly
- administer, develop, support and train provider and parents in the use of a range of Early Years Portals
- monitor the early years performance in order to provide a wide range of data for a range of audiences and freedom of information requests
- monitor the performance and support the development of children's centres
- influence and develop early years services and strategies in line with city priorities
- conduct and/or respond to local and national consultations and research opportunities
- source and apply for new funding opportunities, and when successful provide project management
- fund the early year's infrastructure costs
- allocate the early education grant to settings on a termly basis (including deprivation funding, MNS supplementary funding and disability access funding).
- provide advice and support to early years setting when completing headcount and eligibility checks for 30 hour codes and early years pupil premium.
- complete cross border checks with neighbouring local authorities to ensure funding claims do not exceed the annual entitlement.

Central Expenditure Proposal:

6. It is estimated that central early years functions will cost £473,939 in 2021/22 based on expected staffing requirements. This budget will be funded by deducting £0.16 from the local authority hourly rate (£4.71), meeting the 95% pass through requirement.

Funding supplements

1. All local authorities are required to include a deprivation supplement in their 3 and 4 year old funding formula.
2. Local authorities are permitted to use other supplements including rurality/sparsity, flexibility, quality and English as an additional language (EAL). Plymouth does not make use of these supplement within its 3 and 4 year old funding formula.
3. No more than 10% of 3 and 4 year funding should be channelled through the use of supplements. Supplements should apply to all entitlements, the universal and extended hours.
4. Deprivation is a mandatory supplement and is allocated to providers on a per pupil basis. Eligibility is determined by the Income Deprivation Affecting Children Index (IDACI) score which is linked to a child's home post code. Providers are expected to use the deprivation funding their children attract to support the needs of these children.
5. Deprivation payments are made 2 weeks after the headcount payment.
6. In 2020/21, £0.16 was deducted from the local authority hourly rate (£4.65) to fund the deprivation supplement. The total value of the 2020/21 deprivation budget was £465,809.

Deprivation Supplement Proposal:

7. Plymouth propose to deduct £0.15 from the local authority hourly rate (£4.71) to fund the deprivation supplement.
8. This will generate a total deprivation budget of £438,450, a reduction of £27,359 (5.9%) compared to 2020/21 baselines. This reduction reflects the current underspend against the deprivation budget due to a reduced take up of 3 and 4 year olds on the January 20 census.
9. Plymouth do not propose using any additional supplements in their local 3 and 4 year old funding formula.

Early Years Special Education Needs and Disabilities (SEND) Inclusion Fund

1. All local authorities are required to have an SEND inclusion fund in place for 3 and 4 year olds with SEND who are taking up the free entitlement.
2. Local authorities should target the fund at children with lower levels of SEN.
3. Schools Forum previously agreed to extend the SEND inclusion fund to two year olds where they meet the agreed criteria in order to address the learning needs of these children.

4. Funding allocations are agreed at the Early Years Inclusion panel on a case by case basis and passed onto providers in the form of top up grants. PVI settings currently receive £8 per hour, whilst maintained nursery schools and nursery school units receive £11.91 per hour. The local authority recognises that these historic rates should be updated to reduce the funding gap between provider types. This mirrors the approach taken by Central Government for the 3 and 4 year old entitlement, as all providers receive the same hourly funding rate under the EYNFF, with the exception of MNS's who currently receive additional protection through the supplementary fund.
5. In 2020/21, £0.12 was deducted from the local authority hourly rate (£4.65) to generate a total budget allocation of £355,692. Current budget monitoring shows a predicted underspend of £117,000 against this fund due to a significant reduction in up-take throughout the summer term because of Covid-19. This underspend has supported the High Needs Block, which benefits 2,3 and 4 year olds taking up their free entitlement through the High Needs Inclusion fund and support from the Early Years Inclusion team.

Early Years SEN Inclusion Fund Proposal:

6. Plymouth propose increasing the hourly funding rate that is paid to PVI's through the SEND inclusion fund to £10 per hour, an increase of £2 compared to 2020/21 baselines. Maintained nursery schools and nursery school units will continue to receive £11.91 per hour through this fund.
7. The PVI hourly rate increase is affordable within the current budget allocation of £355,692. Therefore it is proposed to continue with a £0.12 deduction from the local authority hourly rate (£4.71).
8. The hourly rates will be reviewed again in 2021/22 as the local authority aims to pay all providers the same hourly rate from 2022/23.

Disability Access Fund

1. The Disability Access Fund (DAF) is intended to support disabled children in accessing their free childcare place.
2. 3 and 4 year olds in receipt of Disability Living Allowance (DLA) who are also taking up a free childcare place are eligible to receive DAF funding.
3. Providers are responsible for identifying eligible children. Providers will receive an annual lump sum payment of £615 for every eligible child.
4. If a child eligible for DAF is splitting their free entitlement across two or more providers, the DAF will be paid to the child's main provider.
5. If a child receiving DAF moves from one setting to another within a financial year, the new setting is not eligible to receive DAF funding for this child within the same financial year. DAF funding received by the original setting will not be recouped.
6. Funding for DAF is not deducted from the hourly funding rate. DAF is a separate funding allocation that the local authority receives from Central Government.
7. DAF payments are made 2 weeks after the headcount payment.

Early Years Pupil Premium

1. Early Years Pupil Premium (EYPP) funding is intended to support disadvantaged 3 and 4 olds.
2. Early years providers are responsible for identifying eligible children.
3. The eligibility criteria is stated on the EYPP application form, this can be found on the Plymouth Online Directory (POD).
4. Local authorities must fund providers at the national rate of £0.53 per hour per eligible child, up to a maximum of 570 hours.
5. Funding for EYPP is not deducted from the hourly funding rate. EYPP is a separate funding allocation that the Local Authority receives from Central Government.

Maintained Nursery School Supplementary Funding

1. Central Government has confirmed that local authorities will continue to receive the MNS supplementary grant for April – August. Plymouth’s indicative allocation for this period is £154,915. Local authorities have been advised that the September – March allocation is conditional and should be treated as unconfirmed at this stage. Plymouth’s conditional allocation for this period is £216,881.

MNS Supplementary Funding Proposal:

2. Plymouth propose to allocate the full indicative amount (£154,915) to its MNS’s. Both nursery schools will receive their historic lump sum of £90k pro-rated for 5 months (£37.5k), plus an additional lump sum of £79,915 which will be distributed between both MNS’s based on the number of 3 and 4 year olds in attendance during the summer headcount week.
3. It is uncertain whether both nurseries will attract this funding from September 2021 as Central Government has not confirmed the new conditions attached to this grant. The local authority recognises the adverse impact that a possible reduction in grant funding will have on the financial position of both nursery schools and will continue to lobby with Central Government regarding their long term sustainability.
4. Distribution of this grant for September – March will be reviewed once funding allocations have been confirmed.

Summary of provider hourly funding rates:

The table below shows the proposed hourly rate payable to all providers in 2021/22 compared to 2020/21 baselines.

PROPOSAL AND RECOMMENDATIONS FOR SCHOOLS FORUM

Proposals and recommendations:

3 and 4 year old funding:

1. Plymouth propose paying all providers £4.28 per hour from April 2021
2. Plymouth propose making the following deductions from the local authority hourly rate:
 - £0.16 for central expenditure
 - £0.15 for deprivation
 - £0.12 for the SEN inclusion fund
3. Plymouth propose allocating the full supplementary grant for April – August (£154,915) to it's MNS. Both nursery schools will receive their historic lump for to this period (£37.5k) plus an additional lump sum (£79,915) which will be distributed to between both nurseries based on attendance levels during the summer 21 headcount. Distribution of this grant for September – March will be reviewed once funding allocations have been confirmed.

2 year old funding:

4. Plymouth propose to pass on the 2 year old hourly funding rate (£5.36) in full to providers.

Appendix I - Estimated 2021/22 funding allocations for 2, 3 and 4 year olds compared to 2020/21 baselines.

Please note, funding allocations for 2020/21 and 2021/22 are estimates based on attendance levels from the January 2020 census. These allocations relate to the universal and extended entitlement for 2, 3 and 4 year olds and do not include deprivation funding and SEND inclusion funding. Estimated allocations for 2021/22 are based on the proposed hourly rate of £4.28 for 3 and 4 year olds and £5.36 for 2 year olds.
