

## Appendix II: Statement on Compliance with SEA Directive & Regulations

The EU SEA Directive (Annex I) requires certain information to be provided in the Environmental Report. This requirement is translated into UK legislation through the SEA Regulations (2004). This is Appendix I of the Integrated Assessment Report that constitutes the Environmental Report as required by the SEA Directive and the UK SEA Regulations. This Appendix I sets out how the requirements for SEA have been met and signposts where this information is found in the Integrated Assessment Report (February 2017) –and in accordance with paragraph 165 of the National Planning Policy Framework (2012). The Integrated Assessment Report comprises a Scoping Report (February 2017), a Main IA Report (February 2017) plus 14 separate appendices (including a Non-Technical Summary, and the IA Scoping report); this constitutes the Environmental Report for the purposes of the SEA Directive.
