A: **W. HORN BROOK - MAYOR**



GWR Boundary Post

Q: It's very worn, but what is written on the top of the post?

A: **GREAT WESTERN RAILWAY Co. - there is also a hard to read date**



Normandy Hill

Q: In what year was the special road name sign put-up?

A: **May 1947**



D-Day Concrete Matting

Q: What shape are the individual 'segments' in each block of concrete matting?

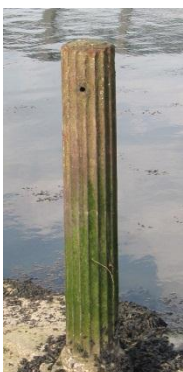
A: **Squares - like blocks of chocolate**



Saltash Coat of Arms in Plymouth!

Q: The Saltash coat of arms features a crown, a shield, a lion, water and what else?

A: **Two feathers**



Metal 'Collar' or Hawse Pipe

Q: Without walking on the old slipway, you should see the remains of an old cast iron lamp column or bollard. Is the post round, octagonal or fluted?

A: **Fluted**
